St. Paul's Episcopal Church



All of us have been affected in the last year by the rise of inflation, causing prices to rise at the same time that product content seems to be magically reduced. Recently this issue intruded itself into our worship life!

Last month I talked with my good friend Toni (Altar Guild) who explained that the 7-day candles we purchased for the red lamp by the altar were only lasting 5 or 6 days. This resulted in one of the members of our Altar Guild having to drive to the Church on Friday or Saturday just to replace the candle! In looking for different suppliers we found that the candles had increased to nearly \$6 each!!

At first, I wondered how a "7-day" candle could be sold for \$6, but it only lasted 5 or 6 days. Since the only users of 7-day candles are churches or faith groups, it would seem that the supplier and manufacturer would deal in a more honest manner, but we shouldn't be surprised we live in the age of greed, just as Jesus did.

My next thought, though, was to take a step back and think about the reason for keeping a candle lit when no one was in the Church most of the week!

The tradition of keeping a candle lit in a red container goes back centuries. In times past, when Churches were left open for anyone to stop in and pray, the red candle was the sign that the reserve sacrament, blessed at Eucharist,

was present in the Tabernacle. This gave people a reminder that the Church is still a sacred space even during the quiet times.

In these "modern" days, leaving the Church doors open for anyone to walk in during the week would be an invitation for vandalism, theft, or much worse. The respect of sacred space by the civic community as a whole seems to have been lost in this age of violence, when even people who are peacefully praying in their own faith tradition become targets of violence and hate.

In discussing this candle issue with Toni I realized that a tradition from a past age was in need of a revision in practice. Rather than leave a candle burning when no one is around (probably not a good idea from a fire risk perspective!) the Altar Guild could light it before any service in the Church, and then extinguish it before leaving. In this way, we still practice the tradition of keeping the candle lit as a reminder of sacred space, while saving the burning of fossil fuel, protecting the Church from fire, and saving the parish \$6 per week. (I must say this last part gladdens the Scottish part of me!)

As I've thought about the meaning and tradition of this sacred red candle, I think it's a good time to call to mind the sacredness of the place we share together each Sunday. This space of worship isn't sacred because we call it a Church, but because we come together as a parish family to worship God and share the Word and the Sacred Bread that gives new life to all of us. In my Celtic beliefs, this repeated coming together in worship and love results in a buildup of divine energy that brings this space closer to the veil that separates this world and the next.

Many of our parishioners come early each Sunday to sit in the quiet praying and meditating, while, perhaps unknowingly, soaking in the feeling of sacred place that surrounds the altar. It is easy each Sunday, as we see each other, to react with joy and excitement in greeting our brothers and sisters. I suggest, however, that you save the greeting for after the service, and instead sit down in the quiet to soak in the love we share and this sacred space we call St. Paul's.

May the Spirit of God walk with you in this time of Lent.

Paddling Through Lent — and Life



Christian Symbols

SHAMROCK — St. Patrick used the shamrock to teach people about the Godhead. Holding up a shamrock, he challenged them, "Is this one leaf, or three?" Inevitably, people replied that it was both, prompting St. Patrick to draw the analogy that so, too, is God: one God in three Persons — the Holy Trinity.



40—In Scripture, this number often indicates a time of trial or testing, or simply marks significance. It rained 40 days and nights during the Flood. Israel wandered in the wilderness for 40 years. Jesus fasted for 40 days and was with the disciples for 40 days between his resurrection and ascension. The Christian church has long observed 40 days of Lent (not counting Sundays).

Why We Lament

In 2020, the coronavirus pandemic struck America during the middle of Lent, a season associated with deprivation. Some people made light of the shutdowns, joking, "I didn't mean to give up this much for Lent!" Others asked why the suffering was occurring in the first place.

Professor N.T. Wright, in an essay for Time, explains that asking "why?" but receiving no answer is key to biblical lamenting. Adding to the mystery, he says, is that God also laments — grieving at the wickedness of humans, despairing over Israel's unfaithfulness. Jesus cries at a friend's tomb; the Holy Spirit groans in anguish.

"Part of the Christian vocation," Wright concludes, is not being able to explain why but lamenting instead. "As the Spirit laments within us," he says, "so we become, even in our self-isolation, small shrines where the presence and healing love of God can dwell. And out of that there can emerge new possibilities ... new hope."
