As Christians we live within our faith that gives us hope for life after this one, as Jesus demonstrated to Thomas and the other disciples after his Resurrection. I'm reminded of this as I was reading various articles and books regarding retirement.

As part of retirement planning, the question comes up "How long do you anticipate living?" How do you answer that? Has anyone found the barcode on us that gives the expiration date? (Please, let me know where it is!)

Recently, I read that a person born in 1956 could expect a life expectancy of age 67. However, if that person makes it to 65, their life expectancy jumps to 77. In addition, if they make it further to age 75 their expectancy jumps to 84! In other words, if you can survive through your reckless, younger years you're may make it a lot further.

Last weekend I gave a talk at the Oregon Council of Machinists and related a story I had heard years ago from a great Union brother, Don Wharton, a retired General Secretary Treasurer of our Union. Don has since passed away, but he was one of those many people I've encountered who are personally inspired to help working people everywhere.

At a conference in Florida many years ago, Don said in his speech, "I have a test for a 'good day'! When I wake up in the morning, before I open my eyes, I stretch out my arms and kick my feet, and if I don't feel the insides of a pine box it's going to be a 'good day'!" Think about that for a second—read it again! Jesus softly chided his followers not to be worried about tomorrow: "And

which of you by worrying can add a single hour to your span of life?" [Mt 6:27] In fact, worrying can be debilitating to your health and reduce a person's span of life.

As many of you know, I start our service each Sunday with "It's a beautiful day!" It always make me chuckle inside when people start looking out the window. I do not connect "It's a beautiful day!" to the weather! It is truly beautiful when I can get up on Sunday and come together with all of you to worship God in a community as God means this world to be—open to every-one regardless of differences.

These ideas of "It's a good day!" and "It's a beautiful day!" collided together in a major train wreck in my head with that idea of "What's my expiration date?" (Sorry, I tend to have some crazy ideas that crash around at times in my inner Solar System of a head!)

If I could somehow hold onto that idea of "It's a beautiful day!" for most of this day, and then repeat it again for the next day and the next day, in time I would start making a collection of "Beautiful Days". Many people collect things: cars, coins, stamps, dolls—even houses! (Take a look at the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, MI). What stops us from collecting Beautiful Days?

The hindrance to Beautiful Days are Legion (reference intended). Too often, we are caught up and twisted up with all sorts of distractions and concerns. Yet any of these myriad of things become miniscule when you reach the end of life and look back.

Imagine, however, reaching the end of this life, and looking back on your proud collection of Beautiful Days! Rather than a regret of what could have been, instead you are comforted with a collection of beauty. In the process of living these Beautiful Days you've also inadvertently passed this optimistic way of living onto those around you. That's part of what Jesus wants us to do with this Hope and Faith we have as his followers.

So, turn off the 24-hour bad news channel, step outside, go to a window, or take a walk. Take some time to smell the flowers, look at the sky, whether cloud-filled or not, listen to the birds or insects, and then give thanks to God for this Beautiful Day. It's in the cries of infants, or the song of bees in a Rosemary Bush, that you can hear a brief echo of the angels in heaven. Peace! - Deacon Greg

### Improve your car gas mileage

∽ Go Easy on the Pedal

Speeding, braking, and rapid acceleration waste gas. Depending on the type of vehicle, poor driving habits can negatively affect fuel economy between 15% and 30%. Based

on the current national average of \$3.09 per gallon (for regular gasoline), driving sensibly, and not like a race car driver, can lead to an equivalent gas savings of between 31 cents and \$1.24 per gallon.

🎐 Slow Down

Gas mileage efficiency tends to decrease above 50 miles per hour. According to fuel economy.gov, for every five miles per hour that exceed 50 mph, drivers pay an equivalent of about 22 cents more for each gallon of gas. While each vehicle has its own optimal speed for fuel efficiency, speeding can result in 7% to 14% reduced fuel economy. Driving at slower speeds can save 22 to 43 cents per gallon.

### Honor Your Mother

Anna Jarvis, the woman who first suggested a national day to honor mothers, had an incredible mother to honor. Her mom, Ann Reeves Jarvis (1832-1905), was a Sunday school teacher and activist who helped lower infant-mortality rates in Appalachia and promoted friendship among families of Civil War soldiers.

At a memorial service for her mother, Anna Jarvis distributed carnations her mom's favorite flower — to attendees. Her idea to set apart one day each year for moms gained traction, and in 1914, President Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May Mother's Day. It was customary by then to wear white carnations in honor of departed mothers and red carnations to honor the living.

Of the white flowers, Jarvis said they "symbolize the truth, purity and broad-charity of mother love; its fragrance, her memory, and her prayers. The carnation does not drop its petals, but hugs them to its heart as it dies, and so, too, mothers hug their children to their hearts, their mother love never dying."

# The Power of (God's) Light

Do most people truly feel happier in spring? Is the light brighter, the sky bluer? Meteorologists say yes. The shorter, blue wavelengths of sunlight scatter more efficiently than long, red ones; as the sun rises higher in spring, the light passes through less atmosphere, making the sky appear bluer. Outdoor levels of light have proven as effective as Prozac to combat depression — and May is the sunniest month!


# April 22-May 13, 2023

For Pentecost, make a thaumatrope, a spinning toy that creates an optical illusion of motion.

#### What you need:

- White paper
- Cup
- Scissors
- Pencil and markers
- Plastic drinking straw
- Glue

#### What you do:

- Using the cup's circular shape, trace two identical circles on the paper. Carefully cut them out.
- 2. In pencil, draw a person's head on one circle. Then place the blank circle on top and use the image beneath to guide you in drawing a flame above the head.
- 3. Color the two images with markers.
- Apply glue to the backs of the circles and sandwich the top of the straw between them so it looks like a lollipop. Let dry.
- 5. Roll the straw quickly between your hands to view a mini motion picture.
