# St. Paul's Episcopal Church



On the rare occasions I've been at home this spring and summer I'm able to sit on our back patio for Morning Prayer enjoying the singing of the birds, the waterfalls of our pond, and the koi fish who are usually still asleep, hardly moving.

We've been blessed over the years with a prolific number of koi, having given away over 150 fish to various places. Even so, we still have more than 30 fish cruising our pond. I don't know the exact number because they keep moving as I try to count them. (Something in the numbers part of my mind finds that rather disjointing.)

This spring we gave four of our fish away to friends, but after the recent spawning we've counted 5 or 6 more new fry zipping around amongst their bigger cousins (or are they parents?).

The colors of our koi are pleasing to the eye. They range from an inky blue to all white, all orange, and some with spots and coverings of various colors. When you watch them enough you notice individual characteristics that are comical. Some like to play with stones, extracting algae from the surfaces, while others climb up on the planters looking for an extra treat. For those who've ever had aquariums, watching fish swim about has a calming effect (that, incidentally, lowers blood pressure!).

As I was watching the fish, I wondered if God watches us in a similar manner. We are many diverse colors, with many different characteristics, and

yet all precious in the eyes of the caretaker.

This month we remember the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the March on Washington, DC, where the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. declared God's Continuing Dream. Dr. King said, "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character."

This remembrance of the March for Justice contrasted with the harsh reality of continuing racism in our country. Another news report emerged of a young, disturbed white man walking into a Dollar General Store in Jacksonville, FL, and commencing to murder people for no other reason than the color of their skin: Angela Michelle Carr, 52, a grandmother, who was working as an Uber driver; Anolt Joseph Laguerre Jr., 19, who had just graduated high school; and Jerrald De'Shaun Gallion, 29, a father with a young daughter.

All of these people were working to support their families yet were murdered by a young white man who was consumed by an evil hatred of others.

It's easy, in these times of mass-marketed evil, to become despairing and

dejected in the face of these tragedies. Yet this is the same evil Jesus faced in his time, and which led to his execution. On Easter Sunday, though, and on every Sunday, hope is re-born with the promise that God will eventually set things right. This doesn't



mean we should just sit back and shake our heads. If we have the hope of Christ, then we have the love of Christ. And if we have the love of Christ, we are meant to carry that love out into the world seeing all the variety of people around us as God's precious children. As St. Paul says, faith, hope, and love are the greatest of gifts. Sometimes just a warm smile and "Hello" can make a difference for those who feel alone. How do you share your gifts?

# Instruments of Connection

Following Jesus involves much more than attending worship, as Pastor Stan Purdum points out in a sermon titled "The Hug":

"The spiritual life, in addition to some outwardly religious and inwardly devotional acts, also includes such mundane activities as sending thank-you notes for gifts

received, returning phone calls, greeting fellow worshipers Sunday after Sunday, surprising our spouse with a spontaneous act of appreciation, helping out at funeral dinners, seeking common ground during disagreements, listening to our children, working at not being a grouch, visiting friends and relatives and, perhaps, even sending an electronic hug. All those things are instruments of connection. The spiritual aspect is the intentionality behind them."

# Who, Me? Yes, You!

The Bible is filled with people who don't feel up to the challenge of serving God, speaking for God or leading his people. But God always knows what he's doing. Pastor Haviland Houston issues this challenge: "When you are hesitant to act, or feel a failure of nerve coming on, when courage lags, or even if laziness and the 'I don't care' blues get you down, may the words of Mordecai to Esther burn in your hearts and minds: 'And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"" (See Esther 4:14.)

Max Lucado offers a similar reminder in *You Were Made for This Moment*. "God always has his person," he writes, also citing the book of Esther. "When we feel as though everything is falling apart, God is working in our midst, causing everything to fall into place. He is the King of quiet providence, and he invites you and me to partner with him in his work."

Lucado continues: "[God] has a Joseph for every famine and a David for every Goliath. When his people need rescuing, God calls a Rahab into service. When a baby Moses needs a mama, God prompts an Egyptian princess to have compassion. He always has his person. He had someone in the story of Esther. And in your story he has you."


