- Do you have faith in it that it will return, and bring your grain to your threshing-floor?
- 13 'The ostrich's wings flap wildly, though its pinions lack plumage.
- For it leaves its eggs to the earth,

- 15 forgetting that a foot may crush them, and that a wild animal may trample them.
- It deals cruelly with its young, as if they were not its own; though its labour should be in vain, yet it has no fear;



May we dwell with you forever together with Mother Mary and all your holy people.


May we join our voices with Saint Francis and with all your little ones throughout the ages; giving you all praise and glory and honor, forever and ever.


