November Epistle

This month marks the annual celebration in this country of the "First Thanksgiving" representing that idealistic gathering of Pilgrims of the Mayflower and the local indigenous population that were mistakenly called "Indians". Massachusetts is as far away from India as there can be and calling the native peoples "Indians" was a mistake of bad geography by early European explorers.

A while back I read Nathaniel Philbrick's "Mayflower: A Story of Courage, Community, and War", which I highly commend to those who may be interested. In this highly researched book, the idealized myth we celebrate today at Thanksgiving is peeled back to bring to life the reality of the religious dissenters now known as Pilgrims.

While the Pilgrims may have been personally motivated by a desire to isolate themselves to start a new religious movement, the journey of the Mayflower itself was financed by corporate funds that expected a return on their investments. In essence, the colony was being outfitted to construct a trading village that would be periodically visited by ships from the company to take back whatever goods the colony could produce, whether from farming, fur trading, hunting, or mining.

Just as modern companies tend to short skirt operations, the Pilgrims landed there low on supplies and facing a long winter. In exploring their initial landing areas on a seemingly unpopulated Cape Cod, they came across an empty native village and a large cache of food. The Pilgrims proceeded to help themselves to the food, returning it to the Mayflower.

Is it any surprise that when the native community returned to the seasonal village and found their food supply cached to survive the winter season, along with the seed for the following year's planting, was missing, they became enraged at these newly arrived strangers? Needless to say, conflict ensued, but far be it from modern mythology to admit the fault lay in the Pilgrims grab and take actions. (It brings to mind the modern-day snatch and grab shoplifters!)

In their first year of building the colony the Pilgrims worked with a religious mindset of a commune, with all people contributing their labors to the community. The result of that first year's efforts was near starvation, only saved by alliances made with a native tribe. The alliances were then used to pit one tribe against another in repetitive wars.

In their second year of farming, the Pilgrims switched to a new economic model where each person cultivated their own patch of land, resulting in an adequate surplus the following winter. The book goes on to describe the lack of supplies from their corporate sponsors, the machinations of colony leaders to reduce the native threat through wars, and the governance of the colony itself.

What struck me in reading this narrative was how the Pilgrims started off with an idealized goal of building a "Christian" colony, but quickly disposed of this "inconvenience" of a fellowship of love under the influence of money and shortcuts to survival.

As I study history, whether in the Bible or more current events, I am struck by how we have advanced so far technologically, but so little individually, particularly as Christians. How might Jesus have met those indigenous peoples in those first landings of the Mayflower? How might Jesus have led those first Pilgrims? How might Jesus ask us as his disciples to live our lives today?

At this holiday of Thanksgiving, let us take pause to remember the native peoples of this country who inhabited these places long before us. Let us remember the corporate sin that continues to place money ahead of people. Let us reflect on how we, in our time, might make better choices in our lives influenced by the Way of Jesus. Yet let us also give thanks for this great country that yearns to live in a fellowship of love while having the courage to examine our past.

May God bless this country with Wisdom in Christ as we celebrate and pray on this Thanksgiving. Amen.






