Tell out my soul, the greatness of the Lord!"

Beginning October 5th with our St Francis Day Pet Blessing service we once again find ourselves in stewardship season, with this year's theme echoing the words of Mary's Magnificat (Luke 1: 46-55). In my mind though 'Tell Out My Soul' will always be the opening lyrics to Timothy Dudley-Smith's wonderful piece of hymnody. I've long had a strong connection with this hymn. In my first posting after seminary (as a Methodist) the youngish organist

in our central city chapel loved the strident rhythm of the usual tune (Woodlands for those interested) and used to play it loudly at the end of each and every service, with literally all the stops pulled out for the majestic A A A D that introduces each verse. It was one of Dudley-Smith's earliest hymns (he wrote in excess of 200 more) and while written in 1961 it was first published in the Anglican Hymnbook in the year of my birth, 1965.

I'm not sure if the Episcopal stewardship office had this hymn in mind when they chose the theme for this year, but I'm happy they did. Stewardship can often feel like an obligation and stewardship campaigns like seasons we need to suffer through rather than embrace. But the Magnificat is really a wonderful example of what our stewardship – and response to it – should be. The young Mary is called upon to give a great deal – indeed her whole future – to God with little in the way of explanation or reassurance and her response is one of joy and worship. The

call of scripture repeats this theme often; to serve God is to offer our whole selves and in doing so to find true life and meaning. I often have to remind myself of that when the phone rings at inconvenient times or an uncomfortable conversation is called for. At those times (and many others) I can choose to Tell Out My Soul rather than gripe and grumble.

In our stewardship campaign this year we will deliberately take time to focus on telling out our souls. We will, of course, also talk about money and time and the many ministries we would love to have people join us in offering. There are opportunities to, as Dudley-Smith wrote, ensure the hungry are fed and the humble are lifted high, as well as ensuring our church is clean and our website up to date. But most of all the invitation of Tell Out My Soul, both the hymn and stewardship campaign, is to be thankful always for God's blessings and to do so in both our words and our actions. I invite you as always to join me as we journey through this season together.



Land Updates: Discussion

The presentation at the Parish Meeting at the end of June has garnered a number of comments from parishioners. Most feel the property should be sold / developed

Option 1-City use of the property for housing unhoused: The City of Modesto has asked us for a decision on pursuing this option by the end of August. The funds committed by the city would only cover the installation of the temporary housing: attainment of utilities, water, sewer service; cement pads. Each unit would have a bed and desk, but no bathrooms. There would be in an ablution block of communal bathrooms. The city only wants a 3-year lease, possibly due to the lack of security for continued funding.

Adjacent businesses: pre-school, charter school, and dentist would have to sign off on allowing the use of the property for housing unhoused. Care would have to be taken regarding the type of individuals allowed to be housed on the property. We have been told we could request clients be the unhoused elderly.

The church has been advised that we would be responsible for funding (through seeking grants) and securing a service provider for the housing complex. St. Paul's would also be responsible for dealing with any property issues that arise (i.e. trash, repairs, etc.). St. Paul's would be responsible for finding volunteers or paying for necessary workers and fixing problems.

<u>Option 2 - sell property</u>: The Vestry may vote to recommend sale but this would also require approval from the Diocese and the Parish.

If Vestry recommends sale of this property, the issue would require approval by the Diocesan Council. If the Diocese approves, then the issue needs to presented to the Parish for their approval.

St. Paul's has been contacted by a commercial enterprise which has been looking for property in our area and is interested in possible purchase of our triangle property. However, this business cannot be revealed at this time, although it can be noted that they would not be contrary to church values. Although, if property is sold, the church will have no control over what the business is.

Dc. Greg, who also serves as the Diocesan Treasurer, advised on how similar funds from other parishes in the diocese have been handled.

The legal contract would be done by the Diocesan Chancellor Michael Glass.

Consideration must be made regarding funds received. Considerations: 1. What is the future of our present buildings and how much resources will be needed to maintain them. 2. What are our major ministries and should income received be used to support special ministries, even if operated by other organizations (eg. Shower Shuttle, Salvation Army, etc.).

After discussion: Motion to recommend sale of the property and to authorize Fr. Brian, Joyce Bell, and Niniv Tamimi to present, discuss, and negotiate with necessary parties.

<u>School Lease:</u> After review by the Finance Committee, it was found that the lease with the preschool is not current and likely expired in 2023. When the original lease expired, the Chancellor added an amendment to that 5-year lease that increased the amount of rent and incorporated a fixed amount for utilities and funds for bathroom supplies and cleaning. He removed the



St. Paul's Episcopal Church Joins Community for Pride in the Park 2025

On Saturday, September 27th, 2025, parishioners of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Modesto, demonstrated their commitment to radical inclusion by joining the annual Modesto Pride Event at Graceada Park.

The church's presence at "Pride in the Park" underscores its long-standing commitment to the LGBTQ+ community, a commitment deeply rooted in the

theology and policy of The Episcopal Church. Members of St. Paul's engaged with the community, offering a welcoming presence".

This show of support is based on the foundational work of the Episcopal Church (TEC) on LGBTQ+ inclusion: "For decades, LGBTQ+ Episcopalians and allies have worked to make The Episcopal Church a place of belonging and inclusion. We have prayed, studied, and discerned, and in doing so, we have seen the evidence of God's blessing in the lives and love of our LGBTQ+ siblings in Christ."

This effort is guided by resolutions adopted by the General Convention of The Episcopal Church. As far back as 1976, the Convention affirmed that "homosexual persons are children of God who have a full and equal claim with all other persons upon the love, acceptance, and pastoral concern and care of the Church" (1976-A069). Furthermore, the church declared that these individuals "are entitled to equal protection of the laws with all other citizens."

The participation of the St. Paul's contingent was a visible expression of this core value, bringing the church's message of unconditional love directly to the heart of the Modesto community.
